Introducing Your District Master

Hello, my name is John Harpole and I ring at St Martin of Tours, Basildon. I learnt to ring under the tutorage of Harry Turner at Shenfield in the 1970s, following my brother and sister up the rickety ladder. During my student days I rang in Guildford, and spent a year in Scotland ringing at Edinburgh Cathedral. I then returned to Essex, and moved to Southend; initially joining the Prittlewell band before moving to Leigh-on-Sea following my marriage to Helen. It was during this time that I was first elected as district master. Work took me to the north of the county, and we moved to Braintree where our two daughters, now 14 and 12, were born. Following a change of job again, we moved back to the Southern District where we have been living in Ramsden Heath for the last 11 years. I have rung over 260 peals, visited over 1250 towers (including "the other" St Pauls Cathedral, in Melbourne, Australia), and one of my targets for this year is to ring my 1000th quarter! While I enjoy ringing surprise major at Rayleigh, I also get real pleasure ringing well struck call changes as part of the Basildon band every Sunday morning and I am very proud of the quarter of Bob Doubles we rang last October for the first Basildon trained ringer.

Thank you for electing me as your new master. It was good to see so many of you at Leigh-on-Sea for our ADM, and I hope to see you all again at the district events that have been arranged for the year.

I'd like to echo Phil's words and say a big thankyou to our retiring officers – Andrew, Chris and Lyn. I'm sure Julia, Cathryn and myself will learn to appreciate over the next few months just how much time and effort they have put into running our district for the last few years! And thanks too to Phil in his role as deputy master, and for agreeing to stay on and show us the ropes.

BRENTWOOD BELL RESTORATION PROJECT

An update

31 January 2008

Just before Christmas the parish received a legacy which, when added to our Bell Fund and the Association's generous grant offers, means that we are now able to proceed with the project. A Petition for Faculty has been submitted and if all goes well the bells being removed in August and returned in December. This is very appropriate as this year is the 125th Anniversary year of the consecration of the present church on the site.

The refurbishment proposal is for the eight bells, all fittings and the cast-iron bell frame to be removed. The bells are to be cleaned, re-tuned and fitted with all new fittings and wheels. They will be mounted on ball bearings which hopefully will make them 'friendlier' to ring. The cast-iron frame too is to be refurbished and stiffened and remounted on the original foundations.

The belfry sound openings will be partially filled at lower levels to provide improved weather protection to the refurbished installation.

The proposals have been developed in consultation with English Heritage, the DAC Bells Adviser, the consulting engineer retained by the parish and the chosen bellhanger.

Annual District Meeting at Leigh-on-Sea
Saturday, 19th January, 2008**

Welcome. The Master, Andrew Beech (North Ockendon), opened the meeting by asking all present to stand in silence to remember members of the District who had died since the last ADM - Alf House (Unattached Life Member, former Rayleigh Ringer) and Don Andrew (Prittlewell Friend).

The Master then welcomed all present and invited everyone to sign the Roll Book. There were 76 members present including the following visitors – Vicki, Colin & Rachel Chapman (Chelmsford Cathedral), Christina & Andrew Brewster (Writtle), Brian Meads (Coggeshall), Allen & Maureen Cansdale (Halstead).

The Master thanked the Vicar, Fr. Ken Havey for taking the Service, Roger Folley for playing the organ and the Leigh-on-Sea Ringers for the use of the bells and for providing an excellent tea. Thanks were also extended to the Service touch band, (*John Harpole, John Cousins, Cathryn Corns, Allen Cansdale, Gordon Lucas, Phil Harrison, Andy Martin and Andrew Beech*).

Apologies for Absence were received from Christine & Steve Halliwell, Julie & Steve Hunter, Lawrence Beal, Clare Beech, Rowena Marshall, Hilary Donoghue, Julia Fry, Penny & David Sloman, Stephen Nash, Mary Arthur, and Irene Gaunt.

Minutes of previous meeting held at Shenfield on 17th November 2007 had been circulated in the last Newsletter. There being no amendments, they were signed by the Master as a true record.

Matters Arising.

- **Annual Dinner.** The Secretary, Chris Bailey (Brentwood), had previously circulated a brief questionnaire from the Association Secretary seeking views as to what format members would support for the Annual Dinner. Completed questionnaires can be handed to a district officer or sent direct to Mary Bone by 30 April 2008. A provisional booking had been made at The County Hotel Chelmsford for 4th October. Attendance has been dropping over the last few years and the Committee were keen to offer an event that best suited the membership.
- **CRB update.** In Steve Nash's (Langdon Hills) absence, Alison Nash (North Ockendon) reported that several attempts had been made to meet the Diocesan Child Protection Officer but no meeting had yet been arranged. Steve is hoping that it will be sometime in February.

- (a) **Notices for Motion at the A.G.M. 5th May at Chelmsford Cathedral.**
At the time of this meeting none had been submitted. A reminder was given that any motions for the AGM, sponsored by at least two members, must be received by the Secretary by 1st February.

Master's Report. Andrew Beech (North Ockendon) presented the following report.

For the past few years our District programme has followed a similar pattern and 2007 was no exception.

*The usual four **business meetings** were held, and the number of members attending were similar throughout the year.*

*Of the two **afternoon practices** held, the February one took place outside our own district at Ingatestone in the SE district. This was well attended and perhaps we should consider doing this again. However, the October practice held at Grays was, in contrast, poorly attended with only about 7 district members supplemented with 3 visitors – one from as far away as Yorkshire.*

*The **training day** in April had Steve Hunter coaching 5 students through Doubles and Minor at Downham in the morning, followed by Triples at Rayleigh in the afternoon. The day was well received by students and helpers alike especially for the 'interesting' Triples section when the student and the helpers had learnt different methods. Thanks to Steve for organising the day; to the students for having the enthusiasm to learn new things; and of course to the volunteer helpers without whom days like that wouldn't be possible.*

*It was pleasing to see six teams entering the **striking competition** at Navestock in May. The kickoff was somewhat delayed after the rope of the third got stuck in the bell chamber whilst being raised. However, the heroes of the day were Ron Brown and David Sloman who tentatively climbed the wobbly ladder to the bell chamber to free the rope. Not a job for the faint hearted! Downham can first with Prittlewell as runners-up. Both teams went through to the Association final at Orsett in July where Prittlewell were placed a creditable 3rd.*

In the 8-bell competition at South Weald the district band, with its slight home advantage, thrashed the other districts to win the trophy. I would like to record my personal thanks to everyone in the team for all the hard work and effort they put in, and for winning it in my last year as District Master.

*26 ringers supported the **district outing** to Cambridgeshire in June. As well as being rewarded with five very good towers we were able to raise £77 for the BRF and, as always, the district officers thank all who supported that event.*

*The **quiz night** at North Ockendon in September attracted 45 people making up eight teams. A marvellous sum of £266 was raised for the BRF. Many thanks to all of you who came along.*

*Although only four teams entered the **call change competition** at Shenfield in November, there were some ringers taking part for whom this was their first experience of entering a competition - which is good to see. It was a closely fought competition this time with some very good ringing throughout and which saw North Ockendon as the winners.*

*The year ended with our **carol service** at Langdon Hills.*

As you all know, I have decided to retire as District Master after 6 years. I have enjoyed that time immensely with, amongst other things, meeting new people and making new friendships. My own personal feeling is that 6 years is a bit too long for one person and it is time for someone else to take the baton and lead the district in a new direction otherwise things can be taken for granted and become stagnant.

*I may be biased but I truly believe that this district is one of the best if not THE best – you only have to delve into the annual report to see why. In terms of numbers of towers the **Southern District** is only the 4th biggest, ok – so we are the 2nd largest when looking at membership numbers, but yet year on year, we continue to raise more money for the Association. Specifically, from the 2006 accounts, our income from service collections is top (£261), our donations are top (£185), and our income from profits on raffles (£221) and surplus on tea money (£221) is significantly above those from other districts. For 2007 you have raised the bar again. Our end of year accounts for all four of those items mentioned – service collections (£279), donations (£264), raffles (£256) and profit from teas (£397) – is greatly increased. This is all down to the commitment and generosity of yourselves and to the full benefit of the Association which, in the end, allows it to plough more funds into bell restoration.*

But being the best is not just about raising money. I think this district also has good friendship and in lots of places there are people, and groups, who are willing to help others in their ringing and learning.

But before I ride off into the sunset, I would like to say a few thanks. Firstly, to all of you who have supported the District events of the past year, I look forward to seeing you again this year from a slightly different standpoint. Please do continue to support as many district events as you can and continue to encourage other ringers at your own tower who may not normally come, to come along with you.

Also, on behalf of everyone in the district, may I record thanks to all the towers and local ringers where we held events last year for their welcome and hospitality.

*On a personal note, I would like to thank the other **District Officers** for all their help and support to me during the past years – especially to Chris who does a tremendous amount of work behind the scenes and has been enthusiastic and thorough throughout the time we have worked together.*

Lastly, may I wish you all a happy and healthy 2008 and above all enjoy your ringing.

Secretary / Treasurer's Report Chris Bailey (Brentwood) thanked those towers which had responded to the request to host District events. A copy of the District Income and Expenditure details had been circulated (copy in the Minutes Book). There were no questions on the accounts. Chris also thanked Andrew for all of his support during the last 6 years and for that from Phil Harrison and Linda Benson. It made the Secretary/Treasurer job so much easier working with such good team players

Education Officer's Report

Steve Hunter's report: was read to the meeting –

During the year we held one Training Day on 21st April. Five students and helpers met at Downham to practice ringing five and six bell methods. In the afternoon we rang at Rayleigh where we extended the methods to triples.

There have been no specific requests from anyone for courses as yet but I am always available if there is a need. This year the training day will take place on April 19th 2008. Unless there is a request for something more specific, I plan to spend the day looking at ways of learning and remembering methods. This day is open to ringers of all standards, from taking your first steps in Plain Bob Doubles to wondering how you will ever remember Cambridge. Please contact me on 01268 767948 if you would like to book a place.

Just to remind everyone, the first Tuesday of each month I run an advanced practice at Rayleigh. The main methods for the next practice (Tuesday 5th February) will be Rutland Surprise Major and Ipswich Surprise Minor. Everyone is most welcome. Ringing for these practices is from 7.30 to 9.30pm.

Nominations for Association Officers. Refer to **Correspondence** above.

Brian Meads (Coggeshall) introduced himself to the meeting and said that he was proposing to stand for the post of Association Master.

The Master reminded the meeting of the letter from Andrew Brewster (Association Treasurer) regarding the retiring Association Officers – (a copy of the letter had been circulated to every tower). Members were asked to respond as soon as possible but by the end of February at the latest.

District Programme for 2008. Details of the District Programme had been circulated at this meeting and at the November meeting and is on the Association website:-

- All meeting venues had now been confirmed.
- Phil Harrison (Thorpe Bay) said that the District Meeting in March at Great Wakering will include the dedication of a Peal Board in memory of David Church; the former much respected Tower Master, who died in 2001. He urged members to make every effort to attend.
- The District Training Day will be on 19th April. (See Education Officer's Report above).
- The District Outing (21st June) – destination to be determined. Last year's outing was very well supported and the Master said it would be good to have the same interest for this year as it is a good sociable day out.
- The Quiz Night with Ploughman's Supper will be held at North Ockendon on 27 September.

With John Harpole's agreement, Andrew chaired the remainder of the meeting.

Any Other Business.

- Chris Bailey (Brentwood) reminded members that subscriptions were now due and asked that where at all possible the Gift Aid Declaration should also be completed. Some members still had Covenants in place which cease when the member attains 65 years of age whereas the Gift Aid declaration has no age limit and it also applies to any donation made to the Association, not just the subscription. The Secretary has plenty of forms for those who are interested.
- Chris Bailey (Brentwood) asked for any changes to Tower Correspondents or tower facilities to be notified to him as soon as possible. An email contact would be most useful so as to cut down on postage.
- Chris Bailey (Brentwood) advised that the Secretary has a good stock of Recruitment Leaflets available.
- John Harpole (Basildon) informed the meeting that Simon Smith, a Rayleigh ringer, was getting married this afternoon (hence the lack of Rayleigh members at this meeting) and he asked the meeting to record its best wishes to Simon and his Bride. (*Applause*).
- Peter Knight (Eastwood) advised the meeting that Jean Hall, an Eastwood ringer, had died during last year. The Secretary asked Peter to provide a short Obituary for inclusion in the 2007 Annual Report.
- Brian Meads (Coggeshall) addressed the meeting about the Essex Ringing Course (10th – 12th April). Places are still available and the cut-off for applications is 14th February. There is a £10 reduction in the course fee for Junior members and the Association Education Fund is also able to assist any Association member financially. As usual helpers are always required, contact Yvonne Towler if you can assist.
- Brian Meads (Coggeshall) also mentioned the Coggeshall Ringing School which run short courses on various topics. They are planning to run three workshops – Handbell ringing, Singles in Stedman Doubles and Raising and Lowering. Later in the year they plan to run a course on aspects of Tower Management – full details on the training page of the Association website. The cut off date for applications is 5th May.
- Beth Johnson (South Weald) said that they were trying to ring a Quarter Peal each month but were sometimes short of ringers. She enquired if there was a forum for letting people know. Beth was advised to use the Essex-Ringing yahoo group email list (Essex-Ringing@yahoogroups.com). This mailing list is not an Association owned list as anyone is able to send mailings to it.
- Robin Page-Jones (Hutton) said that he and several others that he was aware of were unable to access the Association's 'EACR-Notices' Announcement mailing list as included in the last *Rounds & About* newsletter (Dec 2007, p.7) (EACR-Notices@yahoogroups.com). To join the list, just send a blank e-mail to EACR-Notices-signup@yahoogroups.com. Anyone having such difficulties was advised to take it up with Fred Bone, Association Web-Master.
- The Master asked for articles for the February edition of the District Newsletter. Beth Johnson, the editor, needs 'copy' by the end of January at the latest. She also reminded members that she was awaiting answers to the technical quiz on page 6 of the last Newsletter.
- Similarly, articles for the Association Newsletter would also be gratefully received by the Editor, Bryan Morrissey – his details were on the back page of the December 2007 issue of *Rounds and About*.

- The Master reminded the meeting that our first afternoon practice would be at Ingrave on 16th February – 3.00 to 5.00pm. and the next District Meeting will be at Great Wakering on 15th March.
- Phil Harrison (Thorpe Bay) asked the meeting to recognise the contribution which Andrew Beech as Master and Chris Bailey as Secretary/Treasurer had given to the District over the last 6 years. He also asked that Linda Benson's service as Committee Representative over the last 2 years also is recognised. (*Applause*).
