The Ridgman Trophy

The Association is to host the Ridgman Trophy 10-bell Striking Competition in 1994. Outline planning has begun but it's too early to announce the whole arrangements as they have not yet been finalized. Traditionally the competition has been held on the first Saturday following our AGM and broadly involves the Associations and Guilds of East Anglia. Maurice Downs has for the past few years organised our team but this year he announced that this was to be his last year, as reported in the August Newsletter. In his place we welcome Colin Chapman who has agreed to take on this important job.

Committee Meeting

Among the items on the October agenda were two that require further discussion and your opinion would be welcomed. So please discuss them at your ADM. They are as follows:-

A Ringing Simulator: Following the decision taken at the AGM, the Committee discussed whether we should purchase a ringing simulator for the Association, to help with training. If you want to know more about this discussion talk to your District Officers. The outcome is that we have arranged to borrow one from the Central Council from 22nd to 29th January 1994 and install it at Coggeshall. Each district would then book a time slot with Adrian Semken and try it out. You should then be in a position to discuss whether or not you think we should purchase one. The cost ranges from between £600 and £1100 depending on which configuration we purchase and how we want to use it. Your opinions would then be taken into consideration at the Committee Meeting in February 1994. One thing is important unless you try it and discuss it you won't be able to give an informed opinion.

An Association Carol Service: It was suggested that as some districts don't have a Carol Service, we could have one for the whole Association. After some discussion it was agreed that we might try a one-off at Chelmsford Cathedral. Canon Abbey offered to inquire for 1994. The Committee asked Canon Abbey to report back to the next sub-group meeting. Canon Abbey reported that he had contacted the Cathedral Office who had sent a booking form with the scale of charges (which are rather high) and an explanation that the Cathedral was very heavily booked at Christmas time, as you might expect. The sub-group are looking into other possible venues, such as a large parish church. Two questions need consideration:- would there be the support needed to make this a worthwhile exercise, and is there a large parish church that would be willing to accommodate us? Please discuss this at your ADM so that your District Officers can bring your opinions to the February Committee meeting.

The Essex Ringing Course - 1994

Honywood School, Coggeshall will once again be the base for the Course which is to be held from Thursday 7th. to Saturday 9th. April. The now well established format will be followed with theory and practical sessions for individual groups backed up with general interest lectures and a presentation by a guest speaker. Detailed below are the group options on offer for this course:-

- GROUP A A Group for those who can ring Rounds competently and who are ready to take their first steps in call changes etc.
- GROUP B A Group for those wishing to plain hunt on 5 and to progress to ringing the treble to Bob Doubles.
- GROUP C A Group for those who are ready to ring the treble to Grandsire Doubles and Bob Minor.
- GROUP D A Group for those wishing to learn Bob Doubles on an "inside" bell.
- GROUP E A Group for those wishing to learn Bob Minor "inside".
- GROUP F Treble Bob Minor. (a) Treble Bob on the treble
 - (b) "inside" to Kent or Oxford
- GROUP G Cambridge Surprise: Starting with Minor and progressing to Major with theory on the extension to higher numbers.
- GROUP H Tower Management and Teaching Recruits For those who are, or would like to become involved in teaching beginners and developing them into useful members of a band. The course will deal with the stages from bell control to elementary methods and developing a planned approach, running a tower etc.

Helpers are also required to assist at the practical ringing sessions. This is a most vital part of the Course and involves ringing whatever the designated group is working at but does not necessarily involve any instruction or standing with a student. Helpers are welcome at the School and are entitled to attend any of the lectures etc. when their services are not required by their group but they need only attend at the towers if they wish - this means two practical sessions a day of about 1½ hours each side of the lunch break. Please book the dates and offer to help the next generation of ringers!

The Central Council wants to know......

The Code of Practice for the Conservation and Repair of Bells and Bellframes was officially launched on 24th November 1993. The Central Council of Church Bell Ringers are keen, in the interest of ringing, to monitor activity under the Code. They would be interested to know, through the Association Secretary, of any difficulty we encounter when seeking to apply the provisions of the Code and of any instances where it appears that the interests of ringing may be jeopardized.

The Council is also following up concerns about Church insurance, not leaving bells up, and Health and Safety Legislation. Their working-party would be interested to know, again through the Association Secretary, of any cases of difficulty concerning these two areas.

Nominations

Rule 8 of our current rules require that nominations for Association Officers - Master, Secretary, Treasurer and 3 Trustees, and any Notices of Motion must be received by the Association Secretary by the 1st February 1994. All current Association Officers are prepared to stand again but this should not stop anyone else putting forward other candidates.
